# High School Diploma vs. GED/HiSET

The GED/HiSET Preparation Program at North Orange Continuing Education (NOCE) can help you prepare to take the GED or HiSET exams and receive your high school equivalency certificate. The exams assess your knowledge in five academic subjects, set by the State of California, and can be taken in English or Spanish. Once you pass, you will earn a high school equivalency certificate that is generally equivalent to a high school diploma. The program is tuition-free.

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# How long does it take to prepare for the exams?

That depends on you. Classes can be taken part time or full time, in the morning or evening. Regular attendance is required in the GED/HiSET classes at Anaheim Campus, but you work at your own pace. Test accommodations are available for those with a documented disability. At the Wilshire Center, you work at your own pace and set your attendance hours. NOCE offers both a High School Diploma Program and General Equivalency Degree (GED) Preparation programs. GED is a series of five tests assessing your high school education level.



### The five areas include:

- » Language Arts Writing
- » Language Arts Reading
- » Social Sciences
- » Science
- » Math

You must pass all five section exams in order to receive your GED certificate. All community colleges and almost all most four-year institutions may accept GED. Students may check with their selected employer, U.S. armed forces, or educational institution to verify the acceptability of the GED/HiSET certificates. Additional academic support for GED/HiSET Prep students is provided in the NOCE Learning Centers

The cost of the full set of HiSET exams or GED tests is approximately \$150.
